## Colouring Sheets

### Materials Included:

- Magoshe-giizhigad Vocabulary
- Magoshe-giizhigad Colouring Sheets
- Dot-paint Colouring Sheets

## Lesson Objective

*Students will learn Anishinaabemowin vocabulary around Christmas while practicing the fine motor skills needed for tracing, writing, drawing, and colouring.*

## Lesson Outline

1. Look over the Magoshe Giizhigad vocabulary. Click the link below for the audio.
2. Decide which vocabulary you would like to use with your class.
3. Hand out Magoshe Giizhigad colouring sheets. Have children pick what they want, or have everyone colour the same sheet.
4. For younger children, we have dot-paint colouring sheets attached as well.
5. Use as much of the vocabulary as you can. Occasionally ask the children, "Awenen awe? (Who is that?)" as they are colouring.

# Magoshe-giizhigad

## Felt Christmas Tree

### Materials Included:

- Felt Christmas Tree Vocabulary (Soundcloud & Word Document)

### Lesson Objective

*Students will learn shapes in Anishinaabemowin while practicing their fine motor skills.*

### Lesson Outline

1. Cut out 3 pieces of green felt in a triangular shape. Make one a large size (for the bottom), another one a medium size (for the middle), and the last one a smaller size (for the top). These will be for the tree.
2. Next, cut out 10 pieces of red (or any colour of your choosing) felt in a circular shape. These circle felt pieces will be the Christmas ornaments.
3. Next, cut out 5 pieces of felt in assorted colours. Cut them into the shape of a square. These will be your presents.
4. Lastly, cut out a 1 piece of yellow felt in the shape of a star. This will be your tree-topper.
5. Assist children in putting the tree together while teaching them the different shapes. Occasionally ask them, "Aaniin ezhinikaadeg owe? (What is this called?)". Click the link for the audio.
