


ANISHINAABEMOWIN IKIDOWINAN

Words in the Anishinaabe language can be divided into six main categories which also have multiple subcategories:

- o nouns
- \circ pronouns
- o verbs
- o adverbs
- o preverbs
- o particles

with 3rd person verbs and singular nouns being the most commonly learned words





DIMINUTIVE NOUNS (MAKING SOMETHING SMALLER)

Noun

zaaga'igan – lake makak – box miikana – road

Diminutive Noun

zaaga'igaans - small lake makakoons - small box miikananens - small road



Some words already have the diminutive built in i.e. makoons is a bear cub, animoshens is a puppy.


LOCATIVE NOUNS (TURNING SOMETHING INTO SOMEPLACE)



zaaga'igan — lake zaaga'iganing - at/in/on the lake


