

Gagwe-gikendamaawizin 2023

On April 26, 2023 local students from grades 5-8 put their Anishinaabemowin skills to the test in an effort to win this language competition. This annual event showcases local students language skills and how they are able to use the language to communicate and share with others. Teams consist of six to eight students and they rotate through five challenges including a drawing game similar to Pictionary, creating Anishinaabemowin words, and using technology to transmit language back to the community.
