

Ando-gagwe-mikan...



Purpose of the Game:

Ando-gagwe-mikan... is a fun and interactive activity that helps students practice Anishinaabemowin directional vocabulary while developing teamwork, communication, and listening skills. Students work together to collect bean bags using only Anishinaabemowin directions.

Learning Objectives:

By playing this game, students will:

- Learn and use directional words in Anishinaabemowin.
- Develop active listening and communication skills.
- Build trust and cooperation with a partner.
- Practice giving and following directions.
- Increase confidence using Anishinaabemowin.

How to Play:

Scatter bean bags around a designated indoor or outdoor playing area. Divide students into pairs. One student will wear a blindfold, and the other student will act as the guide.

The blindfolded player begins at the starting point.

The guide must direct their partner to the bean bags using only Anishinaabemowin directional words:

- "Giiwedinong!" (Move north)
- "Waabanong!" (Move east)
- "Zhaawanong!" (Move south)
- "Ningabii'anong!" (Move west)

The team that collects the most bean bags wins.

Optional Challenge:

For advanced learners, guides can use complete phrases or sentences when giving directions instead of single-word commands.
